Glastonbury is a distinctive town in Somerset, England that I've had the privilege to visit on three separate trips to Europe.

I've made several drawings of Glastonbury Tor when visiting, and this is my only painting of it. A semi-fabricated, illustrative scene, of a view from the gate that opens to the white chalk pathway up to its top, where a gothic style tower stands.

It's kind of like my closest thing to a Constable influenced painting. A pastoral English landscape with emphasis on the foliage, yet having a touch of mystical fun, which the place — in the west Country of England — is highly associated with, as an ancient, mythology oriented "new age" town.

Is that a Ufo/flying saucer depicted in the clear sky? ? Or a cloud formation?

Science heads know better! It's still an appealing area to me, regardless of its penchant for what I consider to be fanciful mystical apocrypha.

Myths and legends are a main attraction, but I found it to be simply a pleasant and picturesque place to spend time at. I had some interesting experiences and met some interesting people there, fueling my motivation to paint this.
